

1 Texas Lantana *Lantana urticoides*

A container superstar for full sun.

- Heat and drought tolerant
- Blooms nonstop in warm months
- Loved by butterflies and bees
- Trails nicely over pot edges



2 Blackfoot Daisy *Melampodium leucanthum*

Clean, bright, and low maintenance.

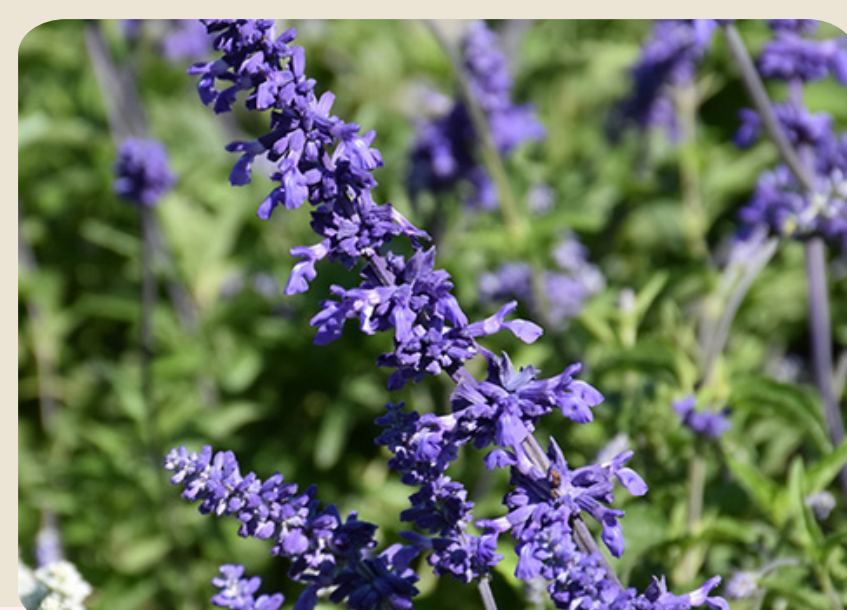
- White daisy blooms with yellow centers
- Thrives in poor soil
- Compact and tidy in containers
- Excellent drainage is key



3 Henry Duelberg *Salvia* *Salvia farinacea*

Classic Texas color and pollinator power.

- Spikes of blue or purple flowers
- Heat-tolerant and long blooming
- Attracts bees and butterflies
- Works well in mixed containers

4 Zexmenia *Zexmenia hispida*

Underrated and tough as nails.

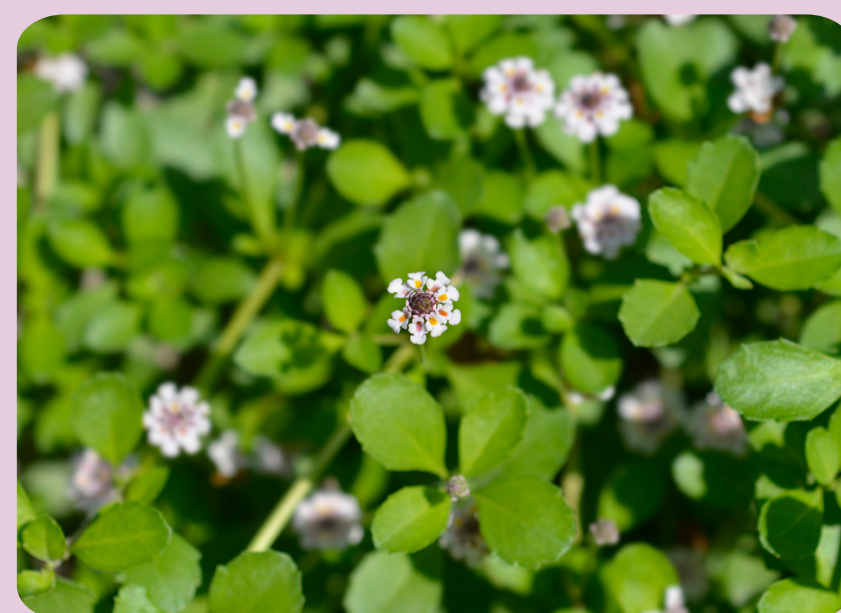
- Golden-yellow flowers
- Thrives in heat and poor soil
- Pollinator-friendly
- Great for wild, natural-style containers



5 Autumn Sage *Salvia greggii*

One of the best all-around natives.

- Blooms spring through fall
- Colors range from red to pink to coral
- Very drought tolerant
- Perfect for sunny patios



6 Frogfruit *Phyla nodiflora*

A pollinator powerhouse with a soft, spreading habit.

- Tiny white-lavender blooms
- Host plant for several butterfly species
- Handles heat and drought.
- Excellent spiller for containers or hanging baskets
