

POLLINATOR MATCH UP



- BUTTERFLIES FLUTTER TO BRIGHT COLORED BLOOMS IN HUES OF **RED**, **ORANGE**, **BRIGHT PINK** AND **YELLOW**.
- OPEN, FLAT, CLUSTERED AND EASY-TO-LAND-ON SHAPES ARE ALSO PREFERRED.



- BEES PREFER **BLUE**, **PURPLE**, **WHITE**, AND **YELLOW** BLOOMS AND CAN EVEN SEE ULTRAVIOLET PATTERNS ON FLOWERS THAT GUIDE THEM RIGHT TO NECTAR.
- THEY DON'T MIND SHAPE AS MUCH AS THEY CAN WRIGGLE THEIR BODIES INTO TIGHT SPACES TO COLLECT POLLEN ALL OVER THEIR BODIES.



- HUMMINGBIRDS ZOOM STRAIGHT TO **RED**, **CORAL**, **ORANGE**, AND **HOT PINK** FLOWERS.
- OFFER THEM THESE COLORS IN A TUBULAR, OR BELL-SHAPE AND YOU WILL HAVE THEM HAPPILY HUMMING ALL SUMMER LONG.



- MOTHS, OUR NIGHTTIME POLLINATORS, ARE ATTRACTED TO **WHITE**, **PALE PINK**, AND FRAGRANT FLOWERS THAT GLOW IN THE EVENING.
- MOTHS LIKE A MIXTURE OF BOTH FLAT, CLUSTERED FLOWERS AND TUBULAR BELL-SHAPED FLOWERS WITH DEEP SOURCES OF NECTAR.
